



**Term (Locum) Academic General Surgeon with Breast Disease Focus, Juravinski Hospital, Hamilton, Ontario, Canada**

Hamilton Health Sciences is seeking a term (locum) academic General Surgeon starting July 1, 2024, initially for a one year period, with the possibility to transition into a permanent position. The surgeon will be based at the Juravinski Hospital, Hamilton, Ontario which serves a catchment area of more than 2.5 million residents. The service provides tertiary and quaternary level care to patients within the catchment area and plays an essential role in the support of other programs at the Hamilton Health Sciences.

The successful candidate is expected to demonstrate experience and training in General Surgery with breast disease focus appropriate for an academic tertiary care level referral centre. They will be expected to participate in Clinical Care and there may be an opportunity to participate in the Acute Care Surgery Service. They will be expected to have good interpersonal and collaborative skills with initiative to further advance the clinical productivity of the Breast Program, including local and regional educational and quality initiatives. Research productivity and a plan for developing a research program is considered an asset. Training in oncoplastic surgery will be considered an asset.

Applicants must be certified (or eligible for certification) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in General Surgery and have completed fellowship training in Breast or Surgical Oncology with a breast focus , with preference given to accredited fellowships. The candidate must be eligible for licensure in the Province of Ontario.
